

## TOCQUEVILLE SOCIETY

#### Annual gift of \$10,000 or more

The **United Way Tocqueville Society** recognizes local philanthropic leaders and volunteer champions around the world who have devoted time, talent and funds to create long lasting changes by tackling our community's most pressing issues.

The society's namesake, Alexis de Tocqueville, recognized, applauded, and immortalized North American voluntary action on behalf of the common good. In 1835, he wrote, "I must say that I have seen Americans make a great deal of real sacrifices to the public welfare; and I have noticed a hundred instances in which they hardly ever failed to lend a faithful support to one another," eloquently capturing the essence of personal philanthropy that persists almost three centuries later.

The **Tocqueville Society of Champaign County**, established in 1995, echoes the American spirit of cooperation and goodwill which Tocqueville spoke about with such enthusiasm. It personifies the true meaning of philanthropy with members giving over \$10,000 annually to the United Way campaign. This group of leaders recognizes the vital importance of voluntary community service and personal giving at an exceptional level.

## **IMPACT: EDUCATION**

In Champaign County we Live United against low rates of kindergarten readiness.

Too many children in Champaign County are not ready to learn when they enter school. Decades of studies have proven that quality early childhood programming sets children up for success. At United Way we're fighting for all children to have an equitable start in school. With an annual investment of \$809,225, our 13 education grants make up 42% of our Community Impact Fund.

In addition to grants, United Way leads several early childhood initiatives. As the CU Cradle 2 Career Kindergarten Readiness anchor institution, we are committed to addressing this issue for the long term. We're investing in high quality programming that will help our children learn and grow.

Launched in Summer 2018, Mother Goose on the Loose is an innovative partnership between the Champaign Public Library and United Way, with support from a generous local family. Mother Goose visits area childcare centers, community events, and familyfriendly places to get our youngest community members excited about learning. Storytimes help children practice social and emotional skills, develop motor, literacy and language skills and cultivate a general knowledge of the world by identifying shapes, colors, animals, and more.

The Getting Ready for Kindergarten Calendar is another great early learning tool. For the past 12 years we have printed 6,500 copies of the calendar, which is filled with daily activities for caregivers and parents of young children. The support of sponsors allows us to print in both English and Spanish. The calendar is distributed free of charge each August to childcare centers and local libraries across the County.

By improving early childhood programs, we will strengthen high school graduation rates, increase students' future earning potential, and decrease crime in our community. This is your IMPACT.




## **IMPACT: FINANCIAL STABILITY**

In Champaign County we Live United against economic struggles.

Too many of our neighbors are lacking in the knowledge or skills needed to be financially independent. While immediate, material assistance is helpful in times of emergency, intangible resources, such as job training and financial education, are equally important in helping individuals be better off in the long run. These skills equip people with the ability to steer their daily lives as well as to help others in the community.

In Champaign County, 32% of households spend half or more of their income on housing. In order to get the most out of their remaining income, strategic financial management is critical. That's why United Way is investing your Community Impact Fund gift into our community's strongest financial education programs.

The U of I Extension's Money Mentors program, a Community Impact Fund grant recipient, matches trained volunteers to individuals who request help with personal finance. The mentors work one-on-one with their clients to help with money management skills, such as budgeting and managing credit. "The most fulfilling part for me is facilitating volunteers who really care, and then seeing mentees set and reach their goals," said Kathy Sweedler from Illinois Extension.



Another program supported by the Community Impact Fund strives for equal opportunity. In an effort to help individuals with employment barriers find success and independence, the Vocational Options Program at Cunningham Children's Home serves youth and adults who have emotional, physical, behavioral, and mental health issues. The staff members help clients explore different careers through on-site job training and coaching.

Furthermore, more than 50 partnering businesses and organizations throughout Champaign County provide

trainees with the opportunity to gain job-specific skills and soft skills necessary for successful employment. Through the Vocational Options Program, everyone wins and businesses in return meet their needs for trained employees.

United Way allocates \$465,692 for nine programs in the community to improve financial stability in every corner of Champaign County. This is your IMPACT.

## **IMPACT: HEALTH**

In Champaign County we Live United against vulnerability.

We often look up to senior citizens in our lives—as mentors, family members, teachers, and as friends. Unfortunately, many seniors in our community find themselves lacking adequate access to critical needs, such as meals and transportation. For the approximately 8% of the nearly 17,000 senior citizens in Champaign County who live alone, it can be even more difficult.

To ensure these members of our community are provided with essential resources necessary for an independent lifestyle, United Way of Champaign County has awarded Community Impact Fund Grants to six local organizations. Their programs for senior citizens offer a variety of services from companionship to delivering meals and providing transportation.



Since the 1960s, Family
Service of Champaign County, a
Community Impact Fund Grant
recipient, has been working
tirelessly to support senior
citizens in our community.
Thomas is a local senior citizen
who has been taking care of his
wife Theresa with the help of
HomeCare in-home services of
Family Service. When Thomas
developed health issues that
required therapy twice a week,
he was concerned that Theresa

would have to be left alone. Family Service was able to increase services to five times per week, allowing Thomas to focus on his own health while making sure Theresa was being provided with care.

The impact of the senior citizen programs reaches beyond just the clients. The caregivers of senior citizens are often employed or have health issues of their own. Programs like HomeCare and Meals on Wheels enabled 1,761 at-risk adults to remain living independently, allowing their caregivers to have peace of mind.

Programs aided by Community Impact Fund Grants serve both city and rural residents of Champaign County. Sarah Bush Lincoln's Peace Meal program delivers fresh, nutritious meals to senior citizens in all corners of our county. Last year, over 350 seniors in Champaign County were provided with over 40,000 home delivered meals. Furthermore, PeaceMeal provides seniors with the opportunity to interact with the staff members, volunteers and other recipients of the meals. To many, fellowship is even more important than the meal itself.

Without a reliable, effective support system, our seniors are at risk. Supporting senior citizens is vital for the overall health of our community. Fortunately, in Champaign County, hundreds of seniors are supported by fellow community members, who help them live independent, full lives. This is your IMPACT.

Membership in Women United is open to women who support the Community Impact Fund by making a Pillar gift (\$500 annually). Our Women United events have all filled to capacity in record time, and more events are being added to meet the demand. Women United's signature event, Power of the Purse, beat all expectations in 2018 by netting over \$78,000. Because of this generous support, Women United has provided college scholarships to 20 local women and supported over 150 people during their stay at the Emergency Shelter for Families since 2015.
