## FY 24 Request for Proposals: Child Well-Being-Preventing Maltreatment and Building Healthier Families Through Mental Health and Trauma Responsive Services

### **Metric Document**

Outcome statements:

Fewer children ages 0-5 will experience maltreatment.

Parents & caregivers, especially those in zip codes 61821 and 61802 will have increased access to supports that reduce stress and risk of child maltreatment.

The community will have increased capacity to address the needs of children and adults who have experienced trauma.
